This page belongs to the silver blue-laced Wyandotte. She has fine black-blue lines between the silver ground colour and blue lacing. The same happens when ground colour is gold. Here with mahogany (Mh). The fine darker (blue) lines between ground colour and blue are even thicker on the double laced Barnevelder. Only difference between single and double laced is Co. On the Indian Game (bantam) there's hardly a dark line between ground colour and blue. Wondering about the black line around the feathers itself? That's called 'edging', caused by the soft hairs around the feather. They absorb more pigment. Edging is due to feather quality.
